Congratulations to Riverview Middle School, our Partner School of the Month. Riverview students completed a total of more than 1,200 objectives in Ascend Math, averaging 31 objectives mastered for each student. More than 56% gained one or more grade levels in Ascend Math with 10% gaining two levels. "Our students who were actively engaged with the program showed positive growth with their trend lines on STAR assessments," writes Jon Lantz of Riverview Middle School. "The students enjoyed the fact that they were only asked to show mastery on concepts they didn't know instead of all standards within a level.
