Your students now have access to the new Treasure Room Awards Wall! The new Awards Wall celebrates students' achievements. They'll receive trophies for objectives, units, levels completed and hours spent working in Ascend. In between the Awards Wall, students will find a treasure chest containing the items they've purchased.

Live Student Tracker Report

We've made a couple of helpful updates to the Live Student Tracker Report. When on the "Reports" tab in Ascend, you'll notice that the link to the report now reads "Live Student Tracker".

You'll also notice that the Live Student Tracker now has a legend to indicate color. Green represents students who have attempted to pass the post assessment zero to two times. Yellow represents students who've had three to five attempts. Red represents six or more attempts.

Tip of the Month

Remind students to log out, not close out. Students should log out of Ascend when they are done in order to make sure that they receive credit for the time they've worked. They should never click the red X in the browser until after theyve logged out.
