


Assign Objectives provides teachers and school administrators the capability to assign objectives outside of a student's automated study plan. When students are assigned an objective, they will be detoured from their automated study plan.

Teachers may wish to assign an objective for a variety of reasons including:


- Opportunity for a student to preview a lesson prior to in class instruction
- Grade recovery in instances in which a student performed poorly on a class assignment or test
- Review of standards

Teachers may choose an objective from the Assign Objectives Page. To search for a standard, select <CTRL> <F> and type in the standard.

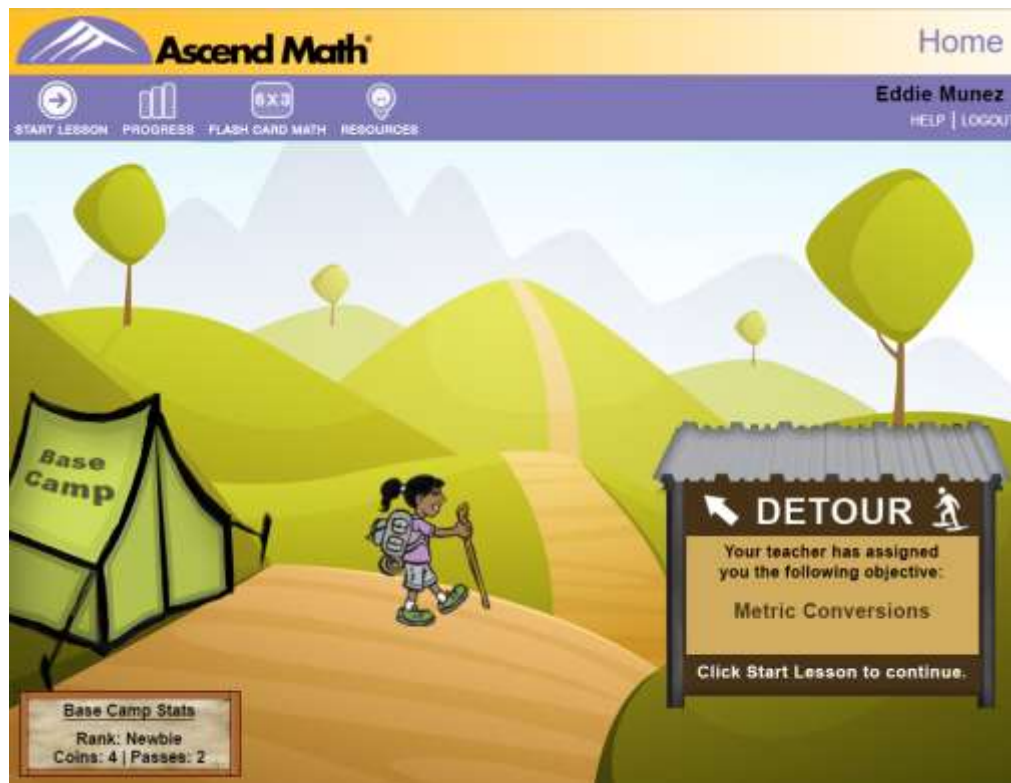


Save / Reset

Students are notified of a teacher assigned objective by a detour sign on their home page. Once students complete their assigned objective, they are directed back to their automated study plan.



Progress on assigned objectives is tracked and reported separately from the student's automated study plan. Time spent on Assigned Objectives is tracked wherever Total Hours Worked is reflected in reports; such as the Activity Completion Report or Total Hours Worked Report. Students may track their time on Assigned Objectives on their Dashboard by selecting Progress on the Home Page.


To view the Post Assessment score of Assigned Objectives, select the Assigned Objective Report under the Reports tab. Select one of your classes from the dropdown menu and a date range, then select Create Report. All assigned objectives completed within the selected date range will appear on the report. The Assigned Objective Report can be printed or saved as a PDF to a location on your computer.

Skiping Assigned Objectives


Administrators and teachers have the option to allow students to skip the detour on their home page. Administrators can access the Admin Settings under the Administration tab to turn this feature on or off for the entire school. Click to check the box next to “Detour may be skipped each login” and select Save. Return to this page to uncheck the box to prevent objectives from being skipped.

Teachers can control which classes may be allowed to skip the detour. After the school administrator has allowed the detour to be skipped for the entire school, classes can be unchecked by accessing the Class Settings under the Classes tab. Under the column “Detour may be skipped each login”, uncheck the box next to the class name to prevent assigned objectives from being skipped.
